**Giles Lamb and his team climb high for local charity.**

Just a year after his son donated all his birthday money to local charity, Children on the Edge at their Easter Chocolate Trail, Giles Lamb decided to go 'one-up' by completing the Three Peaks Challenge to raise funds for their projects.

To complete the challenge Giles and his team had to climb the highest peaks in Scotland, England and Wales requiring some 27 miles of mountain walking, often through heavy rain, and nearly 500 miles of driving – all within 24 hours.

Also braving the slopes were Damian Boyle and Mike Cochrane with Lisa Cochrane undertaking the critical support role of being the non-walking driver.

"We loved the whole experience," said Giles afterwards, "particularly as it was quite a mental and physical challenge. We completed the challenge in 23 hours 36 minutes and 47 seconds."

Between them, in an absolutely marvelous effort, they have managed to more than double their fundraising target, so far raising £555.

This money will go towards providing a better life for some of the world's most vulnerable children. £555 can pay for 6 Burmese refugee children to go to school in India for a year through a scholarship programme provided by Children on the Edge.
