



How does it work?

If you're a taxpayer, you can help us turn every £100 donated into £125. Imagine what a difference that could make, and it doesn't cost a thing. For every pound you give, the charity gets an extra 25 pence from the Inland Revenue by reclaiming the basic rate of income tax you've paid on the donation.

How do I know if I have paid enough tax?

You must pay an amount of tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that charities reclaims on all your donations in the tax year (currently 25p for each £1 you give).

For example if you have made a donation of £10 you must have paid £2.50 in income tax or Capital Gains Tax in the same tax year. Or if you plan to give several donations or a regular monthly donation equivalent to £100 in one year, you must ensure you have paid £25 in tax across the same tax year.

What if I'm a higher rate tax payer?

You can then claim further tax relief on the donation in your annual tax return. For example if you pay a higher rate of tax (40%) and you donate £100 to charity, the charity can claim Gift Aid to make your donation £125. You can then personally claim back £25 (£125 x 20%)
